Are you or a colleague crossing professional boundaries with a patient?





Giving personal contact information to a patient



Communicating electronically with the patient through social media, for personal reasons



Giving gifts to a patient



Paying special attention to a patient (for example, spending time with the patient outside their shift, or on a break)



Discussing personal issues with a patient



Changing assignments to care for a specific patient



Dressing differently for a particular patient



Frequently thinking about a particular patient



Feeling other members of the team do not understand a specific patient



Keeping secrets with the patient
