

Fair Registration Practices Report

Nurses (2015)

The answers seen below were submitted to the OFC by the regulated professions.

The improvements provided acceptable alternatives for applicants to meet the language proficiency and the citizenship requirements. For example: with respect to the citizenship requirement, applicants, whose permit has expired, are now not required to wait until they get a new work permit, as long as they can provide evidence of having applied for a new work permit. This enhances timelines for processing the application and accessing the nursing profession.

The improvements enhanced staff's ability, on behalf of the Executive Director, to make the determination that an applicant has met the requirements for registration in a transparent, objective, impartial and fair manner.

Changes to fees in 2015 include:

- The fee for an evaluation completed at Touchstone Institute was changed from \$200 to \$400 for evaluations completed after October 31, 2015. The fee was increased by Touchstone to continue the process of becoming self-sufficient.
- Fees for candidates who attempt the required examination to become registered as an RPN, other than the Jurisprudence examination, changed from \$240 to \$255 for examinations completed in 2015. The fee was increased due to a higher cost for purchasing the exam from Assessment Strategies Inc.

On March 7 2013, the Council of the College approved the National Council Licensure Examination for Registered Nurses (NCLEX-RN) as the examination for registration as a Registered Nurse (RN) in the General Class as of January 1, 2015. As of January 1, 2015, the Canadian Registered Nurse Examination was no longer available to RN applicants. The first day the NCLEX-RN examination was offered in Canada was January 5, 2015.

ii. Describe the impact of the improvements / changes on applicants.

The NCLEX-RN is more accessible to applicants. This includes year-round access to the examination, access to test centres across Canada, and issuance of examination results in a more timely manner, within 1-2 business days.

As Ontario's nursing regulator, we are accountable for ensuring that registration is granted to only those who demonstrate the nursing knowledge to provide safe care. We regularly review processes for assessing this knowledge in order to determine the most accessible, fair, and efficient approaches. The NCLEX-RN met the College's requirement for being a valid and reliable examination and it leverages advances in technology to enhance efficiency in the examination administration processes.

a)	General Class	<p>Description (a)</p> <p>Most nurses registered with the College belong to the General Class. Both Registered Nurses and Registered Practical Nurses belong in this class.</p>
b)	Extended Class (Nurse Practitioners)	<p>Description (b)</p> <p>The Extended Class is for RNs who have additional education and clinical experience that allows them to practise as Nurse Practitioners. Members in this class have an expanded scope of practice, with the authority to diagnose, prescribe medication, perform procedures, and order and interpret diagnostic tests.</p>
c)	Non-Practising Class	<p>Description (c)</p> <p>The Non-Practising Class is for members who want to remain College members at times when they are not practising nursing in Ontario.</p>
d)	Temporary Class	<p>Description (d)</p> <p>The Temporary Class is an option for applicants who have met all the registration requirements for the General Class <i>except</i> completing the registration exam. Applicants are not eligible if they have failed the exam on one occasion. Members in this class are allowed to practise under defined terms and conditions. They can join the General Class after they pass the exam. Membership ceases at the earliest of the first failure on the exam, expiry of six months or becoming eligible for registration in the General Class.</p>
e)	Special Assignment Class	<p>Description (e)</p> <p>The Special Assignment Class is a time-limited registration for nurses who have an appointment as an RN or RPN with an approved facility in Ontario. Members in this class can only practise within the scope of their appointment and only under defined terms and conditions.</p>
f)	Emergency Class	<p>Description (f)</p> <p>The Emergency Assignment Class comes into force when the provincial government declares an emergency and asks the College to issue Emergency Assignment certificates of registration to qualified nurses.</p>
